

Blue Team Hospitalist Elective Workflow

Blue Team: Monday – Friday, 7AM – 5PM

- Resident will join for sign out in 5th floor workspace at 7AM
- Resident will be assigned patients with APH2. Max of 10 patients.
 - o If APH2 is assigned 10 patients or fewer, resident will see all patients assigned to APH2
 - o If APH2 is assigned 11 or more patients, resident and APH2 pick 10 patients for resident to see and the remainder are seen APH2 independently.
 - o If there are certain patients you feel should be discussed prior to resident rounding independently then discuss that with the resident.
 - o Resident will round independently on their assigned patients.
 - o APH2 and resident should pick a time to meet and discuss their shared patients after resident has seen their assigned patients, ideally prior to 11AM multidisciplinary rounds.
- Resident will write all notes on their assigned patients and APH2 will attest notes.
 - o Rounding nurses WILL open progress notes for the resident.
 - o Rounding nurses WILL NOT do H&P for the resident (but can open the template).
- Resident will do admissions with restricted blue team attending in the afternoon until 3:30PM.
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Night 1: Monday – Friday, 5PM – Midnight

- Resident will arrive at 5PM.
- Resident will receive sign out from blue team attendings.
- Resident is expected to triage and handle calls and/or PerfectServe messages with the Night 1 attending. The goal is for the resident to get experience handling things independently, with the support of the attending. For example, calls may be made on speaker phone so the resident can be the primary communicator and the attending consult as needed and provide feedback.
- Resident will admit patients with Night 1 attending who arrive up until 11p.
- If there is downtime during a night shift resident should work on PREP questions, preparing for morning report, or discussing educational case/article with Night 1 attending.
 - o Educational materials will be available on hospitalpeds website.
